FRUIT IN ABIDING - BY BEC FORTUNATOW

As I write this I find myself hurtling towards Christmas and the end of another year. I don't know about you but I feel like I have been playing catch-up all year.

Time is such an interesting concept and in the face of Eternity and our walk with the Lord even more so. God's word advises us to use our time wisely because we do not know what tomorrow holds.

But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"

"Martha, Martha, "the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed-or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."

Martha works hard to welcome Jesus to her home. Her sister Mary of Bethany, simply sits at the feet of Jesus and listens.

Both Mary and Martha serve, yet Mary understands the priority and necessity of choosing to abide with Christ.

It is so important for us especially during times that are traditionally busy, to recognise the importance of pulling aside and taking the time and space to abide in him.

John 15:1-8 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you.

Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches.

Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned.


If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples.

Bearing fruit is not manifest as being busy or productive. It is reflecting the love of Jesus to a world which is lost.

It is living life in His Power and His Presence. It is only possible by spending time and having that close relationship with Jesus.

I encourage us all to purposefully carve out that precious time to abide in him ,so that he also may abide in us .

We have pencilled in a Baptismal Service for Sunday 1 Dec 2024 and/or 4 Feb 2025. These dates are shared that we might ask – Have you been water baptised? (Acts 8:36)

Water baptism is one of the most beautiful and significant moments in your journey as a Christian. This simple act of obedience as a Believer, has powerful supernatural significance.

Water baptism is a public declaration of our faith in Jesus Christ and the outward demonstration of the inward transformation that takes place when we receive Him as our Lord and Saviour.

The Bible is clear that salvation is a free gift from God and is received simply through faith in Jesus. We get water baptised, not in order to be saved, but because we have already received the gift of salvation. Salvation precedes water baptism. For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast. Ephesians 2:8-9

Water baptism is very symbolic. Colossians 2:12-14 says: *If it's an initiation ritual you're after, you've*

already been through it by submitting to baptism. Going under the water was a burial of your old life; coming up out of it was a resurrection, God raising you from the dead as he did Christ. When you were stuck in your old sin-dead life, you were incapable of responding to God. God brought you alive - right along with Christ! Think of it! All sins forgiven, the slate wiped clean, that old arrest warrant cancelled and nailed to Christ's Cross.

Water baptism is a symbol of Jesus Christ's death, burial and resurrection. We enter the water as a symbol of entering into a relationship with Jesus Christ, coming just as we are, clothed in our old life with all of its habits, mindsets and behaviours.

Allowing ourselves to be immersed in water by somebody else during the process of water baptism, is symbolic of willingly yielding our life to God's rulership as an act of love, obedience and trust. God sees the faith in our vulnerability and humility and is pleased.

The water itself is symbolic of a grave. As you are immersed, your old self dies and is buried just as Jesus died and was buried. In the same way, just as Jesus rose to life again, you too rise from the water as a symbol of new life in Him as a brand new creation. The water is not magical in any way, but like everything in the Christian life, being water baptised is a powerful act of faith and any act of faith pleases our Heavenly Father. Water baptism uses the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ to symbolise our journey from death to life, and from old to new.

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PRAYER AND OPPORTUNITY TO PRAY

Praying is not our final option, but our first response. Praying is not an action of reaction, but taking the initiative in faith. Matthew 6:5-8 records Jesus saying the phrase three times: "When you pray..." Not if you pray, but when you pray.

The assumption or implication here is that we all should pray. Prayer is powerful. When we need something, we pray! Healing – pray! Help – pray! Peace – pray!

Jesus said in Matthew 6 to "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened."

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 reminds us that it is God's will in Christ Jesus that we rejoice always, pray continually, and give thanks in all circumstances!

In Acts 16, the Bible records that Paul went looking for a place of prayer. We need to take the initiative, and stir ourselves up to pray. Here are a few opportunities:

Sun 9.30-9.50a (Weekly)

Each Sunday morning, we pray before our Church service and prepare our hearts to worship, and bring glory and thanks to our Lord God.

We pray for one another and pray that our hearts would be open to the leading of the Holy Spirit, and that we might show love towards one another.

Sun 6.30-7.30p 3 Nov (Monthly)



On the first Sunday of each month, we will gathering for Evening Prayer and Earnestly Pray. Acts 12:5 says: 'So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him.'

Earnestly means fervently, or deeply, or intentionally are other words that describe this word earnestly. As does 'to stretch' or 'reach' or 'be in tension'.

EP Nights are about praying with intentional desperate confidence,

without ceasing, to the Lord to move, transform, open up and save.



CHOICES WE MAKE - EXCERPTED FROM PR BARRY SILVERBACK

Not all choices in the life of the believer should be accepted. Every christian is faced with a choice between what is permissible and what is not beneficial for the believer.

All choices have their outcomes and the believer is required to ask what will be the results from those choices made or about to be made? Will they be helpful or harmful? Will they be consistent with God's advice in scripture?

Do we accept or refuse things offered to us which are allowable but not necessarily beneficial or helpful? Not all choices we make simple 'black and white', right or wrong.

Some things are complicated and require discernment. That is why we are encouraged to go to God for his counsel.

Notice that the Apostle Paul's choice to refuse what was lawful or permissible (1 Cor 6:12). The matter may have been acceptable for Paul to do, but it was not helpful for him or his mission. The lesson as a believer is that it is not always a matter of what is permissible or easy which is the deciding factor.

Every believer should be considering what affect the choice will have on their spiritual life and growth, and how will it "fit" with the mandate and commission that God has given to every believer.

Notice that King David refused to receive to a piece of land for worship in 1 Chron 21:23-25. In David's case it is because he was aware of the moral and spiritual values that pertained to his personal relationship with God.

He did not take something just because it was free. For David, his worship was something to come from his own life, his own sacrifice, his own provision, his own relationship with the Lord.

May we be more discerning and seeking the wisdom of the Spirit's guidance to our hearts -asking "is this choice to accept right for me?
