PENTECOST SUNDAY & MAY SERIES - POWER & PRESENCE

The first half of this year has been given to our identity, vision and who we are in Christ. On our website at www.stirlingfamilychurch.au, we have our statements of vision, declaring that...'we see a church living in His Power and Presence'. This is who we are, expressed as vision.

In June, we will consider our mission statement with the month given to the Gifts of the Spirit and how the gifts enable and empower us for the work of the ministry, and minister to one another as salt and light, and as witnesses of Jesus. The emphasis of June is for our passionate anticipation in our opportunity of personal evangelism in the everyday moments, as the Lord brings people across our everyday moment paths.



Earnestly means fervently, or deeply, or intentionally are other words that describe this word earnestly. As does 'to stretch' or 'reach' or 'be in tension'. EP Nights are about praying with

CHEERFUL GIVING & ANONYMITY OF EFT



Please note our new EFT details for Church banking, now with Westpac.

Our world is ever changing, and so are the security protocols placed upon the banking system. It seems good old cash remains a great option! With recent regulatory and service changes to the banking system, some 'OSKO' transfers and EFTs how the 'account name' of the sender – that is the giver.

In raising a query with the bank, they advised that this is unavoidable and cannot be removed or masked.

It is important to appreciate that the Church does not 'total' or 'track' any giving from a specific giver. However bank statements can and some do record the name of the account from

ministries, and ministry training school.

where the transfer originated. This make sense in general, however for a Church, this is matter worth knowing.

The alternatives for those desiring their giving to remain anonymous is the most obvious method being good old-fashioned cash!

We receive a physical offering every week, and cash is 100% anonymous!

Another method, which is inheritably anonymous as a result of a single nightly settlement transfer, is EFTPOS.

The EFTPOS machine is kept near the Coffee Machine on Sunday's, and transactions attract a service charge of 1.45% on top of any giving amount.
