

“A conqueror defeats and nullifies the purpose the enemy. To be more than a conqueror is to make His foe His slave, and causes the enemies plans to serve His purposes.” (John Piper) (see Acts 26)

God not only delivers us from our suffering; He also makes our suffering serve His purposes and glory (see 2 Cor 4:17, Gen 50:20)

God overcomes opposition making them servants of His purpose.

The Who of our salvation is greater than the who of our opposition.

Freedom to be a child of God...in our ‘trust’

- **But to anyone who did accept him, he gave the right to become God's children; yes, to anyone who believed in his name. (John 1:12)**
- **For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. (Rom 8:14)**
- **For you are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus. (Gal 3:26)**
- **Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has become a child of God. (1 Jn 5:1)**
- **So now Jesus and the ones he makes holy have the same Father. That is why Jesus is not ashamed to call them his brothers and sisters. (Heb 2:11)**
- **And this is God's plan: Both Gentiles and Jews who believe the Good News share equally in the riches inherited by God's children. Both are part of the same body, and both enjoy the promise of blessings because they belong to Christ Jesus. (Eph 3:6)**

Parental Roles by Example (see Luke 11:13)

Nurturer: curates physical and emotional security

Models: teaches life skills, values, behaviour

Boundaries: sets boundaries and teaches consequences

Advocate: sensitive to the child's needs, inspires growth and vision

to explore, learn, and develop within a loving family

to trust in the love and direction of parents

to be humble, thankful and enjoy my place at the table



Freedom to be a child-like child of God:

**Trust in the love of God
Trust the direction of God
Be humble and thankful
enjoy ones place at the table**

- not childish, immature

Freedom to be a child of God is not saying...

- **Immature behaviour or thinking are said to be controlled by their *inner child*. Exhibit moments of particular selfishness or pettiness, are incidents of the *inner child's* personality taking control.**
- **Or our natural desire for expression, carefree relaxation, joy, wonder, and enjoyment – take a day do something fun, “setting *my inner child free.*”**
- **Scripture points to a child of God to always be maturing and bearing fruit...**

Scripture doesn't seem to support the idea that there is a “real you” being somehow covered up by life’s hardships.

Negative experiences in our lives not always, but often result from our own choices or the sinful choices of other people (Heb 2:1–4; Pro 9:12).

When we are selfish, greedy, jealous, disunifying, temperamental, or out of control (Gal5:19-21), we’re not being controlled by some damaged version of our “inner child” – we are expressing our old nature.

The solution is always humble child-like faith to put on Christ, and to delight in the saving relationship of Jesus (1 Cor 6:9–11).

Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you your heart's desires. Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust him, and he will help you. He will make your innocence radiate like the dawn, and the justice of your cause will shine like the noonday sun. Be still in the presence of the Lord, and wait patiently for him to act. Don't worry about evil people who prosper or fret about their wicked schemes. (Psalm 37:4-7)

"The words you speak to your child become their internal voice,"

I [the Lord] will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with My eye upon you. (Psalm 32:8)

Freedom to be a child of God who exhibits 'child-like' faith

- **The Bible speaks of being amazed and full of joy in the Lord**
- **Our Heavenly Father provides His children with experiences that trigger our sense of childlike wonder (Psalm 19:1; 147:4; Malachi 4:2)**
- **Kids never tire of joys that adults take for granted (dangerous)**
- **A child of God never stops practicing **child-like faith** (Matt 18:2-3) and trusting the ways of the Father, in obedience**
- **Child-like faith freely submits to the Father's guidance (Psalm 119:105) and His goodness (Luke 11:11-13)**

Freedom to live with child-like faith is to know God's goodness!

- **blessed assurance and security (Rom 8:14-17)**
- **the gift of His Spirit (Luke 11:13) and eternal life (John 3:1-16)**
- **joy, peace, hope for everyday living (Rom 15:13)**
- **a loving church body of Christ family to love and belong (1 Tim 5:1-2)**
- **relational Father (Rom 8:15) and loving correction (Heb 12:5-6)**
- **children after God (Matt 5:45) imitating God (Eph 5:1)**
- **forgiveness (1 John 2:12) and access to God in prayer (Matt 7:11)**
- **confidence in His provision (Matt 6:25)**
- **freedom in Christ (Galatians 5:1)**

‘burdens’ will limit the goodness of being a child of God


That, however, is not the way of life you learned when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus.

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires;


*to be made new in the **attitude of your minds**; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.*
