


Tribulation / Bible Prophecy / 70 weeks (Preterist / Historicist / Futurist / Idealist)


Signs of the end times







Approach	General Description	Prophetic Example
Preterist	Past	Jerusalem in 70AD.
Historicist	Happening	Progression of Christian history.
Futurist	Future	Future events yet to come.
Idealist	Timeless	Describes spiritual truths. Good prevails over evil.

Daniel 7	Preterist	Futurist
3 Beasts (vs. 2-6)	Babylon, Persia, Greece	Babylon, Persia, Greece
4th Beast (vs. 7-8)	Ancient Rome	Revived Rome (future)
10 horns (vs. 7)	1st Century Roman Emperors	Future earthly leaders
"little horn" (vs. 8)	Nero	Future "Antichrist"
"Ancient of Days" (throne of judgement) (vs. 9-12)	70AD - Destruction of Jerusalem	Judgment on the future "Antichrist"
Son of Man receives Dominion (vs. 13-14)	33AD - Jesus' Ascension	Christ's rule over the Millennium








