

























Living water...bread of life (v25-40)

v27 Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval."

(fills/entertains)(work for what Jesus gives/endures)

v34-35 "Master," they said, "give us this bread—give it to us always!" "I am the bread of life," replied Jesus. "Anyone who comes to me will never be hungry! Anyone who believes in me will never be thirsty!"

Recall> John 4 - Living water...never thirst v35 - Bread of life...never hunger

Living water...bread of life (v25-40)

John 4 – **living** water...never thirst v35 – bread of life...never hunger 2Cana, 3Pharisee, Gentiles; 4Samaritan/s; 5Pharisees; 6Crowd, Judeans, d/Disciples

v41-42 ...the Judeans there began to grumble about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven."

v27 "food that endures" v35 "I am the bread of life"
v41 <I am the bread that came down from heaven>
v51 "I am the living bread which came down from heaven." BUT WAIT...

Eat In Christ (v41-59)

v51-53 I am the living bread that came down from heaven.

Whoever eats this bread will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world."

Then the Judeans began to argue sharply among themselves, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" (Lev26, Deut28)

Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

(PAUSE - YAWYE, Word, Clothing & Communion)

Word of God

Living, Powerful, Sword (Heb4)
Endures, Lasts, Forever (Is40)(Mt24)
Blesses (Lk11) Accomplishes purpose (Is55)

Sanctifies, Cleanses, Washes (Jn17)(Ps119)(Jn15)(Eph5)

Bread (Deut8,Mt4)(Jn6)(Job23) Gold, Honey (Ps119)

Word became Flesh (John 1:14)

[Word is needed to live, delights like honey]

Consume the Word, eat my flesh, follow me...clothed in Christ!

Eat In Christ (v41-59)

Word of God

v29 "This is the work God wants of you," replied Jesus, "that you believe in the one he sent."

v35 "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

v40 "For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life"

v47 Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life.

FAITH Language

v56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them.
(Resists pride 1Pet5/Jam4) (Grace John15)

New Creation Language

v56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them.

(John15-abide)

Rom 13:14...clothe yourself with the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ. And don't let yourself think about ways to indulge your evil desires.

John Chrysostom (AD 347–407) described putting on Christ as "never to be forsaken of Him, and His always being seen in us through our holiness, through our gentleness" (ie Infusion/union/abide)

Eat In Christ (v41-59)

New Creation Language

v56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them.
(John15-abide)

Gal 3:27 And all who have been <u>united with Christ</u> in baptism have put on Christ, like putting on new clothes.

'Enclothed Cognition' (2012 Northwestern University)
wearing certain clothes has a tangible effect
on the wearer's psychology and performance.
-Reinforces identity. Comforts. Confidence. Attracts.

New Creation Language

Col 3:10 Put on your new nature, and be renewed as you learn to know your Creator and become like him.

Eph 4:24 Put on your new nature, created to be like God — truly righteous and holy.

v56 Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them. (John15-abide)

Mystery of the new creation union in/with Christ

"The Word of God is like a lion. You don't have to defend a lion. All you have to do is let the lion loose, and it will defend itself." - Charles Spurgeon (abiding with a loose lion) Word became Flesh (John 1:14) Eat my flesh Put on Christ, clothed in Christ! (3) Clothed in Christ, do we let the lion loose?

v56 Anyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I remain in them.

v59 He said this in the synagogue, while he was teaching in Capernaum.

Within the John 6 context, Jesus was doubling down, offering a dividing road moment...seeing is second; faith always first

...Communion?

Eat In Christ (v41-59)

Jesus is the lamb of God, our sacrifice. (Jn1:29,He7:27)

Jesus ended sacrifices, altars and the priestly order.

Jesus offered for all time a single sacrifice = now SEATED (He10:11-12)

Jesus cleared the temple, rebuilt it in three days, priesthood of all believers.

The Romans destroyed the temple, smashed the physical sacrificial system.

'Some' believe each Eucharist to be a fresh and new sacrifice of Jesus.
...that Jesus Christ is truly present under the appearances of bread and wine and is offered up as a sacrifice.

Transubstantiation is <u>hard</u> to justify in the bible. It is <u>hard</u> to believe by what authority could a prayer of consecration could cause the elements of the Lord's Supper to transform into the body and blood of Jesus. It is <u>hard</u> to deduce from scripture how Jesus would permit himself to be physically present in the elements, and reduce a very practical application of individual faith in remembrance.

Leon Morris (1971) said... The language of eating and drinking is "a very graphic way of saying that we must take Christ into our innermost being"

[BenB (2024) Jesus sifts the wheat from the chaff]

To whom shall we go? (v60-71)

v29 "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent."
v36 "you have seen me and still you do not believe"
v43 "Stop grumbling among yourselves,"
v60 "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?"
v64 "Yet there are some of you who do not believe."

v66-67 From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him. "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Jesus asked the Twelve.

[Do we need to turn back?][Do we need to declare anew?]

To whom shall we go? (v60-71)

Hard teaching? More a hard heart!

Three 'believe' responses to Jesus

- Do not 'believe', turn, and 'leave'
- 'Believe', declare Jesus and 'abide'
- Act 'believe' but not 'abide'
 (John 15)(asking&fruit)(fruitless&fire)
 (Matt 7)(pratice&pride)(I never knew you)(recognise/abide)

v60 Hard...<teachings>?

v68-69 Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go?
